2nd Place Winners of the
Zonta International Emma L. Conlon Service Award**

Established in 1948, the Emma L. Conlon Service Award contest for Z and Golden Z Clubs is one of the longest running programs of Zonta International. It helps high school, college and university students develop leadership skills, promote career exploration and encourages members to participate in community, school and international service projects. It aims to recognize those Clubs whose projects and programs best express the ideals of Zonta International by contributing to the advancement of the status of women worldwide. The award money (\$250 for 2nd place winners) is to be used for the club's service projects. The application requires the club to name three service projects in each of the three categories of service: 1. School Service consists of projects or programs that benefit the sponsoring school. 2. Community Service consists of projects or programs that benefit the local community. 3. International Service benefits an international organization, cause or community other than the one the club is located in. It may be a project that raises funds or resources for organizations such as UNICEF or UNIFEM (now UN WOMEN), or contributes to one of Zonta International's designated international service projects.
